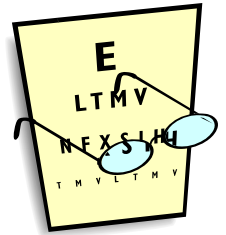
End of Summer Luau & Luncheon

Members may register one additional person per trip at time of registration. Non-member guests please add \$5 for the cost of each trip.

Times and events are subject to change. Return time is an estimated time of return, it depends on traffic, event wrap up, and any travel delays. Day trippers should check in with the bus driver for exact departure and arrival times. If a member has a medical condition and must pre-board on the bus, a doctor's note must be on file with the staff. **ALL participants MUST have an**

emergency medical form on file prior to each trip. Parking for an extended or overnight trip is on the lower level of the parking garage.

Participants in wheelchairs that are unable to use the restroom or participate on their own will need to bring along a companion and all fees apply. You will also need to tell the Baca staff of your condition when you register so proper arrangements can be made for use of the lift.

TRIP CANCELLATION POLICY

In the event of a cancellation, a CREDIT for the amount of the trip will be added to your account **ONLY IF**:

- 1) The Allen R. Baca Center cancels the trip.
- 2) A substitution has been made from the waiting list to fill your spot.
 - A) If no substitution can be made and the request is made 14 calendar days or less from the start date of the trip, all fees are forfeited.
 - B) If no substitution can be made and the request is made 15 calendar days or more from the start date of the trip, a credit for the amount of the trip will be applied to your account or you will be assessed a \$25 processing fee for a refund.

A \$25 processing will be applied for cancellations of Baca transportation provided overnight trips.
