# EFFICIENT IRRIGATION REBATE GUIDELINES

## Qualification:

- Applicant must be a *direct* water customer of the City of Round Rock in good standing.
- Rebate is for **existing** systems only; not expansions or brand-new installations.

## Application Procedure:

1. No pre-inspection or pre-approval is necessary. Simply implement the desired upgrades.
2. Once retrofits are completed, submit application and **itemized and dated** receipts. Addresses are below.
3. You may be contacted to schedule a final inspection.
4. A rebate check will be mailed to you 2 - 4 weeks after the final inspection is completed.



## Explanation of Eligible Retrofits:

- Conversion of zone to efficient, low volume nozzles—conversion of existing zone from traditional spray heads to more efficient multi-stream, rotating heads, or low emission heads (i.e. Toro Precision Nozzles, Rainbird RN nozzles, Hunter MP Rotators, or K Rain rotary nozzles) *\*This is not an exhaustive list, others may qualify.*
- Converting zone to drip or bubblers—conversion of a shrub bed or parkway strip (area between sidewalk & street) that is currently irrigated by pop-up irrigation. Drip system must have appropriate pressure regulation, a filter, & pressure release valve; or capping all overhead irrigation and installing individual bubblers at plants that require it (i.e. trees).
- Capping a zone—the removal and capping of an existing zone. This may be because the area has been converted to hardscape, or plants are mature and do not require regular irrigation.
- Pressure reducing valve—may be one master valve on the system or individual zone valve pressure regulation.
- Weather and/or Water sensors—may be a combination sensor (i.e. freeze and rain, or a soil sensor), a complete weather station, or a new controller or add-on device that uses weather technology to prevent irrigation during rain events, or when sensor determines the additional water is not needed. - Check valve—Includes heads with built-in check valves or the actual check valve that will be installed in an existing head. Applicable only to heads with low-head drainage.

## Terms:

- Rebates for sensors, controllers, pressure reduction, and check valve are 75% of the cost of the *device(s) only (not labor or tax)*.
- Rebates for the zone retrofits are awarded on a zone basis. **ALL** of the heads within the zone must be converted in order to receive the rebate amount for that zone. If the costs of the retrofit are less than the maximum rebate amount, you will be rebated the amount of the product. (i.e. new nozzles for a zone cost \$25, you will be rebated \$25, not the full amount.)
- A **dated and itemized sales receipt** *must be* submitted with the program application within 60-days of purchase or installation date to qualify.
- Maximum rebate is \$400 per residential water account, \$800 per commercial or multifamily water account.
- The City does not endorse specific brands or irrigators, nor is responsible for the performance or repair of the new equipment.
- A *working rain shut-off device must be installed* at each controller in order to qualify for any rebate. A new device would be eligible for the rebate.
- Rebate is available on a first-come, first-served basis until funds have been expended.
- The City reserves the right to change program eligibility or end the program at any time, without notice.
