



Dear *Donor*,

This letter is a solicitation for financial support for the Round Rock Veterans Monument located in Veterans Park on Pecan Street. Round Rock Parks and Recreation is doing a revitalization of Veterans Park utilizing grant funding from Housing and Urban Development. As part of their proposed improvements, a Veterans Monument will be installed honoring as many known veterans from Round Rock as possible. The recognition of individuals will be engraved bronze plaques that include the information about the veteran or those currently serving in all branches of the United States Armed Forces. There will be special recognition for those Killed in Action, Missing in Action, or held as a Prisoner of War. Unfortunately, the grant funds do not cover the cost of individual recognition.

There are 3 levels of giving that will be permanently recognized on a plaque to be installed at the Round Rock Veterans Monument. The levels are \$5,000+ = 3 stars, \$2,000+ = 2 stars, and \$1,000+ = 1 star. All donations are appreciated and needed to fully recognize identified veterans.

PARD has asked a group of veterans to make recommendations on the design of the Round Rock Veterans Monument and to raise funds for individual recognition meeting the following criteria:

- Veterans buried in Round Rock Cemeteries that are without family or friends to pay for their recognition plaques
- Veterans that lived in Round Rock for at least 5 years and moved away for care or to be buried
- Any veteran who will be recognized as Killed in Action, Missing in Action, or Prisoner of War

The Round Rock Veterans Monument will reflect the respect and appreciation this community has for our past and present military men and women who sacrificed so much for us. Thank you for your consideration.
