


# Historic Round Rock

E. S. Slaughter owned this lot from 1877 to 1880. In that year, the current building was constructed, possibly by G. W. Allen, with spaces for two businesses: 108 East Main and 110 East Main. In 1977, the two spaces were combined by White's Auto.

## 108 East Main "Dieckmann Groceries" Built 1880



From 1881 to 1889, Mrs. Adelheid Dieckmann owned and operated her grocery store at this location. The back portion served as her home. From 1890 to 1900, this was the Round Rock Bank. C. W. Rowe bought the property in 1900, and by 1902, this was a dry goods store. J. C. Jackson moved his furniture store (founded 1897) to this location by 1909. In 1931, he commissioned the art deco façade. Jackson's furniture store continued through the 1940s, after which time E. H. Johnson ran a feed and paint store until 1972. From 1977 to 1985, White's Auto was at this location.

## 110 East Main "General Store" Built 1880

In 1882, Henry Pfluger bought this property, later owned by his brother William until 1903. A general store operated here until 1909, when J. C. Jackson bought this building and the one adjacent, operating a furniture store and undertaker's. Jackson's store continued until the 1940s, when the second Sam Bass Café opened here. By 1971, White's Auto had moved in, and that business had expanded into 108 East Main by 1977.
