Shop and Yards, Old Round Rock, Tex.

In 1878, this lot was owned by Bigelow Yates. By 1882, he had sold his interest to Mrs. C. A. Johnson. She sold the building to Archibald M. Dumars, who opened a confectionery and fruit store called The Red Front. The interior walls of this building appear to date from Dumars' ownership in 1887. Simeon A. Pennington bought Dumars' stock in 1889, and a year later sold interest to H. B. and T. C. Sheppard. It was a combination confectionery, fruit, and jewelry store in 1896 and a general store by 1902. By 1916, the façade had been damaged, and the present brick face seems to have been added in 1920, possibly when the two brick buildings across the street were built. In 1961 Sam Thomas operated Angel's Gift Shop in this location. Between 1964-68, The Buckhorn Barbecue and then the Longhorn Barbecue restaurants occupied this space. Round Rock Printing was located here from 1976 until 1991, when E & E Printing took over the store.
