



# 2010 Decennial Census Profile

City of Round Rock, Texas

The **decennial Census** is a 100% count of all persons living in the United States and its territories on April 1 of the Census year. Because it is used primarily for Congressional apportionment and redistricting, it is relatively short, including only the figures given below. Figures differ from the American Community Survey (see reverse) because the ACS is derived from a sample of residents, and the Census is a 100% count of all residents.

Unlike the Decennial Census, ACS data is derived from surveys sent to a sample of residents rather than a universal count. The One-year ACS reports data from a survey taken in a single year; the Five-year ACS combines these responses from the last five years. The Five-year ACS thus incorporates a larger sample size and is more accurate, but because it covers a longer time period it is not as current as the One-year ACS.
