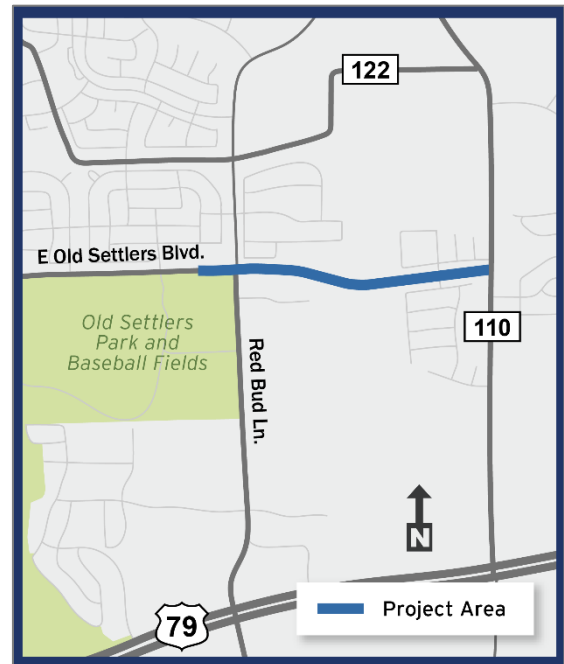


# Old Settlers Boulevard Extension

The Old Settlers Boulevard Extension is part of the City of Round Rock's Transportation Master Plan to address current and future transportation needs. As traffic demands continue to increase in Round Rock, the City is dedicated to preserving residents' quality of life by providing safe travel, reducing time spent in traffic, and improving mobility for drivers, pedestrians, and bicyclists. The Old Settlers Boulevard Extension will complete a new segment from Red Bud Lane to County Road 110, extending this important east-west corridor and providing greater connectivity for residents to other roadways and destinations in the community.

## Improvements

- Constructing a new four-lane extension with a center median and dedicated left-turn lanes
- Constructing twin bridges over McNutt Creek
- Constructing a closed storm drain with curbs and gutters
- Constructing a continuous shared-use path and continuous sidewalk
- Constructing corridor fencing along Old Settlers Boulevard adjacent to the Siena subdivision
- Installing traffic and pedestrian signals at the intersection of Old Settlers Boulevard and CR 110



## Project Funding

The City of Round Rock is funding the design for the project. A combination of city and county funds may be used for construction.

## Project Schedule

- Design is anticipated to be complete by 2022.
- Construction is anticipated to begin in 2023 and be complete in 1-2 years. Additional information about the schedule will be available as the project progresses.

## Community Involvement

A public open house was held in early 2021 to share the preliminary design plans for community feedback. A second meeting was held in mid-2021 to share the refined design plans.
