Rain barrel sale

The 50-gallon, black barrels cost \$77.50 each, and City of Round Rock water customers can combine this deal with the City's rainwater rebate to lower the cost to \$52.40; however, you do not have to be a City water customer or resident to purchase barrels.

Barrels may be ordered through March 25 or while supplies last at <u>roundrocktexas.gov/rainbarrel</u>, followed by pickup at the City's Bob Bennett Building, 3400 Sunrise Road, in early April.

Turning the page to a new chapter

The new Round Rock Public Library, located at 200 E. Liberty Ave., opened its doors to a large crowd on Jan. 28. An estimated 7,403 people visited throughout the day and participated in family-friendly activities on all three floors of the new building.

The new library is the last major project from a series of bonds approved by voters in 2013. The 66,000-square foot building now offers outdoor garden spaces, flexible conference rooms and training/educational labs, and remains conveniently located in the heart of the community in Downtown Round Rock. With additional space and modernized features, this new building, which was designed by PGAL, Inc. and constructed by Hensel Phelps, will allow library staff to expand core services and programming. A 289-stall parking garage was also built next to the new library to provide free parking for visitors to Downtown. The entire cost of the new library was \$34.7 million, which included construction and furnishings, and the cost of the parking garage was \$13.4 million. The library building was funded through the 2013 voter-approved bond package and cash from the City's General Self Finance Construction fund; the garage was funded by Type B sales tax revenues.

"This is truly a library for the community, intended to serve people from all walks of life," said Round Rock Mayor Craig Morgan. "This building, and the programming that will happen in it, will help shape the future of Round Rock."
