**Tax Impact Estimate**

If voters approve both propositions at \$274 million, the total tax rate — including the debt rate and maintenance and operations rate — is expected to have an impact of \$0.069 on property taxes, with an estimated \$36-48 annual property tax increase for homeowners over the next five to seven years based on a median home value of \$369,000. The City Council passes an annual budget and determines the final property tax rate on an annual basis. The estimated impact was designed to be similar in scope to the impact of the 2013 GO Bond program.

## TIMELINE

### 2017-2022

City gathered input on capital projects through the Recreation Center Needs Assessment, Tourism Game Plan, Parks and Recreation Needs Assessment, Citywide survey and Round Rock 2030 Comprehensive Plan.

### DEC. 2022

City Council received list of capital projects to be considered as part of a bond package at retreat

### FEB. 2023

City Council calls bond election

### JAN. 2023

Round Rock Public Library opened, marking completion of final project from 2013 GO Bond package

### FEB. 2022

City staff directed to put together bond package for Council's consideration

### DEC. 2021

City Council began discussing potential large capital projects at retreat
