Round Rock voters will be presented with two bond propositions totaling

for long-term capital projects:

Tax Impact Estimate

If voters approve both propositions at \$274 million, the total tax rate including the debt rate and maintenance and operations rate is expected to have an impact of \$0.069 on property taxes, with an estimated \$36-48 annual property tax increase for homeowners over the next five to seven years based on a median home value of \$369,000. The City Council passes an annual budget and determines the final property tax rate on an annual basis. The estimated impact was designed to be similar in scope to the impact of the 2013 GO Bond program.


