The Round Rock

So how did we get our name? Well it dates back to the early 1850's when a small community formed near a large anvil-shaped limestone rock located in the middle of Brushy Creek. This now famous rock marked an important low-water crossing for wagons, horses, and cattle. Hundred-year-old wheel ruts are still visible in the creek bottom. On August 24, 1854, at the suggestion of postmaster Thomas C. Oatts, the town officially became Round Rock.

When the City implements water restrictions, all customers must comply with the watering schedule for outdoor water use.

Water Concerns

Think you have a water leak? Water pressure seem low? Can't find your shut-off valve? Our Water Distribution Team can help! While they can't repair leaks on your side of the meter, they can determine if the leak is on the Citv's side, which could prevent you from paying unnecessary plumbing costs. WASTEWATER (SEWER)

Whether you use the toilet or the sink, it all flows through the same pipes in your home. Wastewater treatment technologies are designed to break down bodily waste and toilet paper ONLY. While wipes and grease may "disappear" when flushed or poured down the drain - they do not dissolve fast enough to flow through the system like toilet paper. They build up in pipes and block your sewer line. Effects of an Overflow..

"If it isn't body fluid or toilet paper, It Doesn't Go...Don't Stop the Flow."

NO Wipes in the Pipes.

Even those labeled "flushable," they are too thick and do not disintegrate easily.

NO Paper Towels, Napkins or Tissues.

All are designed to absorb moisture and stay intact when wet, not break down.



✓ Health issues NO Grease, Fats and Oils. Just like in the pan, when grease cools down in the drain, it hardens and becomes a pipe-clogging wax. Once cooled, pour leftover grease and oils in a can then toss in the trash.

Wastewater Concerns

STORMWATER (DRAINAGE)

The City works to prevent pollution of our creeks and rivers from stormwater, urban runoff and illicit discharges. Contrary to popular belief, water that enters the stormdrain, flows directly into the nearest creek... no treatment, no filtration.

GARBAGE & RECYCLING

Residential curbside collection services are managed by the City and performed by Central Texas Refuse. Garbage is collected once per week and recycling every other week on the same day. Containers may be placed at the curb starting at 7 am the day before collection and removed by 7 pm the day after collection.
