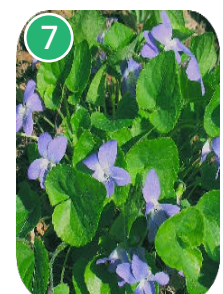
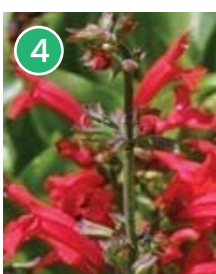
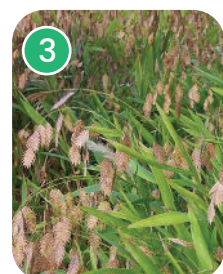

PRODUCT DETAILS

- 24 starter plants, 8 different varieties in 3-inch pots
- Boxed gardens are 2 ft. x 1 ft. in size (they will easily fit in your vehicle)

WHITE AMERICAN BEAUTYBERRY

Callicarpa americana

Plant Type	Shrub	Bloom Time	Summer
Mature Height	4'	Character	Deciduous
Plant Spread	4'-6'	Light Requirement	Part Shade to Dense Shade
Fruit Color	White	Water Requirement	Low to Medium

Description Long arching branches of this wild-selected Texas native produce small inconspicuous pinkish white flowers which mature into beautiful glossy white berries for fall and winter. An excellent shrub for shade areas. BONUS: Berries provide food for songbirds and other wildlife!



PINK TURK'S CAP

Malvaviscus arboreus 'White Lightning'

Plant Type	Perennial	Bloom Time	Spring to Fall
Mature Height	3'	Character	Deciduous
Plant Spread	3' +	Light Requirement	Full Sun to Full Shade
Flower Color	Pink	Water Requirement	Low to Medium

Description A versatile Texas native shrubby perennial hibiscus that produces flushes of pink blooms in even the shadiest spots. Easy to grow and often self-spreading. A favorite of hummingbirds and some butterflies.



INLAND SEA OATS

Chasmanthium latifolium

Plant Type	Ornamental Grass	Bloom Time	Summer to Fall
Mature Height	2'-3'	Character	Deciduous, Semi-evergreen
Plant Spread	2' +	Light Requirement	Part Sun to Full Shade
Seed Color	Bronze	Water Requirement	Low to Medium

Description Beautiful and drought tolerant ornamental grass that produces big drooping spikelets. Can form dense mats in shady areas. Provides great winter interest if left unpruned.



CEDAR SAGE

Salvia roemerianai

Plant Type	Perennial	Bloom Time	Spring to Summer
Mature Height	1'-1.5'	Character	Deciduous, Semi-evergreen
Plant Spread	1'	Light Requirement	Part Shade to Full Shade
Flower Color	Red	Water Requirement	Low

Description A showy native perennial bloomer for shady spots, cedar sage produces striking red blooms in spring and summer that are a favorite of hummingbirds and native pollinators. Spent flowers reseed easily and can be spread to nearby shady areas if desired.



TEXAS SEDGE

Carex Texensis

Plant Type	Perennial	Bloom Time	Late Spring, Early Summer
Mature Height	1'	Character	Semi-evergreen, Evergreen
Plant Spread	1'	Light Requirement	Part Sun to Full Shade
Flower Color	White	Water Requirement	Low to Medium

Description Native, low-growing groundcover and ornamental fine-textured clumping grass-alternative that thrives in the shade. Small inconspicuous lowers bloom in summer and rise just above the foliage.

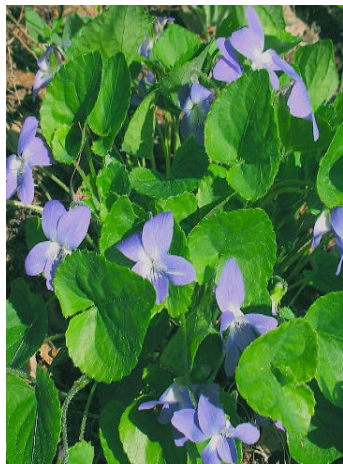


Southern Shield Fern

Thelypteris kunthii

Plant Type	Fern	Bloom Time	N/A
Mature Height	3-4'	Character	Semi-evergreen
Plant Spread	3'	Light Requirement	Part Shade to Full Shade
Flower Color	N/A	Water Requirement	Low to Medium

Description Tall, triangular shiny dark green fronds emerge in spring, growing up to three to four feet tall. Slowly spreading over time to form a reasonable groundcover.



Wood Violet *Viola missouriensis*

Plant Type	Perennial	Bloom Time	Early Spring
Mature Height	1'-2'	Character	Semi-Evergreen
Plant Spread	1.5'	Light Requirement	Part Shade to Full Shade
Flower Color	Purple or Lavender	Water Requirement	Low to Medium

Description

A native perennial groundcover with striking spring blooms that loves shady areas. It's semi-evergreen heart-shaped leaves vigorously creep to cover bare soil. Perfect for the shaded spots under trees, or on the Northern exposure of structures.



Heartleaf Skullcap *Scutellaria Ovata*

Plant Type	Perennial	Bloom Time	Spring, Fall
Mature Height	1'-2'	Character	Semi-evergreen
Plant Spread	2'-4'	Light Requirement	Part Shade to Full Shade
Flower Color	purple-lavender	Water Requirement	Low to Medium

Description

The thick, greyish green leaves are large compared to other native skullcaps. Heartleaf skullcap spreads like a groundcover from fleshy rhizomes to form a short colony. Small purple-lavender flowers appear from April into July as the plant. It can remain somewhat evergreen in warm winters.
