Water Conservation Tip for the Season: Fall and winter are the best times to plant trees! Newly planted trees focus on getting their root systems established during the cool season.

Winter Water Use

Be sure to shut off sprinklers this winter to keep your wastewater bill low!

Each year, the City takes your average water use for November, December, and January to calculate your wastewater usage. Typically, water use is the lowest this year due to little or no outdoor water use.

Landscapes typically don't need supplemental water during this time as rainfall usually supplies enough water and plants go dormant.
